

National Emergency Briefing

On 27th November 2025, at the **National Emergency Briefing** (NEB), ten UK leading experts briefed an invited audience of over 1,200 politicians and leaders from business, culture, faith, sport and the media with the latest climate related implications for health, food, national security and the economy.

The live event has been edited into a short film due to be released on 7 April 2026 for national TV and UK-wide local screenings.

Ways to Take Action

1□ Learn more and share

Watch and share the **emergency briefings playlist on YouTube**. Note: These are listed to the right hand side of the introductory speech and are each around 10-15 minutes long.

2□ Call for a televised screening

Sign the **open letter** - calling for a televised emergency briefing - this is targeted at the Prime Minister and the UK national media heads.

3□ Become a 'Connector'

Suited to people who have access to existing organisations, venues or professional networks. Share film screening information with potential screening hosts, encouraging them to register interest in hosting a screening. Read more **information about this role**.

4□ Hosting a screening locally

The short film is released on April 7th and you can host a screening locally. Apply to **host a screening** - you could do this in connection with other groups in your area. If you do put on a screening, take a look at the info, graphic assets and social media/ press template in this **supporters pack** and in the useful **People's Emergency Briefing Screening Guide**.

5□ Organise a post-screening event

Host a discussion or assembly after the film screening.
