As it is a large PDF, here is a light-weight summary of the colour scheme. As a convenience to web authors, this page also has the hex values of the colours. If you need CMYK or PMS codes, they are in the original document, which is also the place to go for the full guidance.

## Main colours

When you see the logo it's often black on green, but it can also sit on the other backgrounds.
